The National Film Preservation Foundation (NFPF) was created by the U.S. Congress to preserve and to make publicly accessible our nation's film heritage.

The NFPF (1) gives grants to individual public and nonprofit archives and (2) organizes and administers funds for national film preservation and access projects involving many institutions. These programs support the preservation of films not preserved by commercial interests, improve access to film for education and exhibition, and encourage public commitment to the preservation of film as an art form, historical record and cultural resource.

The NFPF awards cash grants as well as grants of preservation services donated by commercial film preservation facilities. In addition the NFPF allocates and distributes preservation funds secured for national cooperative projects.

In 2003, the NFPF awarded preservation grants (approximately \$397,000 in cash and donated laboratory services) to 43 nonprofit and public organizations. Since starting our preservation grant program in 1998, we have provided preservation support to 98 institutions across 34 states and the District of Columbia. These efforts have resulted in the preservation of more than 630 films and footage collections. In addition the NFPF completed substantial work on two publications, *The Film Preservation Guide: The Basics For Archives, Libraries and Museums* and *More Treasures From American Film Archives: 50 Films, 1894-1931*, both of which will be published in 2004.
