Statement of Program Accomplishments

The National Film Preservation Foundation is the nonprofit organization created by the U.S. Congress to preserve and to make publicly accessible our nation's film heritage. The foundation's programs preserve American films that would be unlikely to survive without public support, improve film access for education and exhibition, and encourage public commitment to preserving film as an art form, historical record, and cultural resource.

The NFPF (1) gives film preservation grants to archives, historical societies, libraries, museums, and universities, and (2) organizes, secures funding for, and manages collaborative projects that enable film institutions to work together to promote the preservation of and public access to American film. Since starting operations in 1997, the NFPF has provided preservation support to 167 institutions across 44 states, Puerto Rico, and D.C. and helped save 1,270 films.

The foundation receives most revenues through contributions from individuals, corporations, and foundations; donated services; government funding; and wholesale DVD sales. In 2007, the NFPF received \$530,000 in federal funds authorized through *The National Film Preservation Foundation Reauthorization Act of 2006* (Public Law 109-9, Title IIIB) and secured through the Library of Congress. These funds were distributed as preservation and access grants. The NFPF raises every penny of operational support from other sources.

Program highlights of 2007 include:

- Expanded film preservation activities to 6 new states and 17 new institutions, investing \$651,318 in preservation projects (\$530,000 in federal funding; \$80,120 in donated services; and an additional \$50,000 in cash). Among the grant-supported projects are *When Lincoln Paid* (1913), a "lost" Francis Ford film found in a barn; *That Man of Mine* (1947) starring Ruby Dee; the Yiddish-language *Der Purimspiler* (1937); *The Daughter of Dawn* (1920) with a Native American cast; John Huston's *Let There Be Light* (1946); the pioneering anti-VD film, *The End of the Road* (1919); the World's Fair panorama *To the Fair!* (1964), and home movies of Elvis Presley's band on tour. Introduced was a new program for archival graduate schools to provide students an opportunity to work on a film preservation project as part of their professional education.
- Released the 4-DVD set *Treasures III: Social Issues in American Film, 1900-1934*, the first video anthology exploring the social activism of American film in its formative decades. The 12-1/4 hour set with book and commentary showcases 4 features and 44 shorter comedies, serial episodes, cartoons, newsreel stories, melodramas, and advocacy films covering topics ranging from the vote for women to workplace safety. Contributing preservation work were George Eastman House, the Library of Congress, the Museum of Modern Art, the National Archives, and the UCLA Film & Television Archive. *Treasures III* was listed among the top 10 DVD sets of the year by *The New York Times*, *The New Yorker*, and *Time*. Free copies were given to all state libraries. *Treasures III* was made possible through grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities and the National Film Preservation Board of the Library of Congress. Please note that many of the 2007 production expenses are reported on the 990 as "Cost of goods sold."

- Started production of *Treasures IV: American Avant-Garde Films, 1947-1986*, a 2-disc set presenting films preserved by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, the Anthology Film Archives, the Museum of Modern Art, the New York Public Library's Donnell Media Center, and UC Berkeley's Pacific Film Archive. The set is funded in part through grants from the Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts. Release date: Winter 2009.
- Continued to promote film preservation through distribution of our award-winning book and DVD publications: *The Film Preservation Guide: The Basics for Archives, Libraries, and Museums* (2004), a primer which has been translated into Chinese, Farsi, Korean, and Thai for use abroad; *The Field Guide to Sponsored Films* (2006), the 3-DVD *Treasures from American Film Archives* (2000, reissue 2005); and the 3-DVD *More Treasures from American Film Archives: 1894-1931* (2004).
